CATASTROPHIC REACTIONS & SUNDOWNING

- → Catastrophic reactions are sudden, unexpected responses that appear to be overreactions to what would normally be viewed as mild stimulation.
- → Sundown Syndrome: increased agitation and aggressive behavior that occurs late in the day.

WHY does my loved one do that?

- Surroundings are too stimulating, confusing, new.

- ☑ Brain damage from the disease causes misunder-standing of surroundings.
- Side effect of medication.

TRY to avoid or smooth out unwanted behavior.

- ☑ Simplify the surroundings.
- ✓ Maintain a steady routine and schedule.
- ✓ Maintain a postive matter-of-fact, calm approach.
- Simplify instructions and do not ask questions that require good memory.
- ☑ Do not argue. What seems real to your loved one is different than what is real to you.
- ☑ Suggest a medication review.
